Minutes for Meeting on January 8, 1981 at Edinburgh Castle

The meeting commenced with speeches by Maya Peterson and Harvey Loucks. Maya said that she believed that Harvey was better suited to be club president. Harvey's platform was that the club should be fun, offer discounts on parts and tools, and he felt like helping do some of the work. He proposed a 2-3 day rally this summer in the foothills of the Sierras, mainly because the USNOA rally is far away in Tennessee this year. He would encourage Bob Marshall's series on pre-Commando Nortons. He proposed to keep track of club finances and have a calendar of events for the year.

While the ballots were being handed out by Tom Horton, Art Sirota (that's me, folks!) announced that 11"x14" photos of Peter Williams on his JPN would be available next month from Bob Marshall for only \$1.50 each. Proceeds will go to the club treasury.

Mike Heth spoke about the spares scheme and how we should all support it to get it going. Boyer ignitions for \$73, Cambray wheels for Nortons for \$70 off the regular price. The owner of Gander and Gray in England sent Mike a personal letter concerning details of the Boyer ignitions.

New order forms and price sheets for the spares scheme were unveiled. Jan Barton gave a short speech pointing out the difference between the RITA and Boyer ignitions. (The RITA has to have a battery, but the Boyer can run off the capacitor only.)

Harvey Loucks was announced as winner in the close race for President. He made a short acceptance speech and proposed creating a new post of Vice President. Maya was then nominated and elected. The V.P. will help the president and aid in moral support.

Mike Heth reminded everyone to renew their memberships on time to avoid making extra work for club officers. Also, we need input for the Norton Notice. Lastly, anyone with a printing "in" near the Redwood City-Palo Alto area should please contact Bob Marshall. Meeting adjourned!

Entries are limited to about 300 riders who must make checkpoints within allotted times. At the end, there is a banquet and awards presentation, and successful finishers receive a pin, patch, decal and belt buckle designed for the '81 event.

Hotel/motel accommodations and tourist information is available. Road Riders Motorcycle Association of Vancouver also offers their famed five day tour of British Columbia.

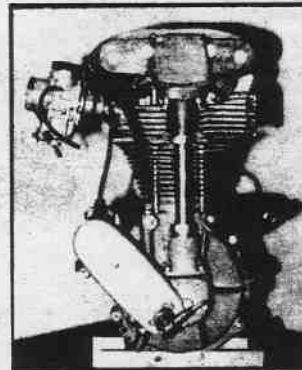

### NORTON INTERNATIONAL

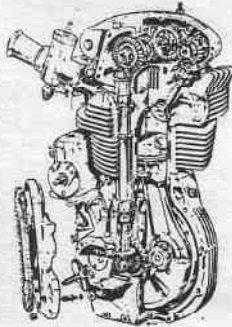
This month's centerfold Norton was made available by Branch member Charlie Taylor. This 1949 International Model 30 (500cc) is a daily-use machine that Charlie rode to the USNOA Rally this summer much to the surprise of the staunch Commando riders. "How hard is it to get parts for those", some one asked. "Impossible", Charlie ended the conversation.

The International Models 30 (490cc) and 40 (348cc) were introduced in 1932 for a greatly inflated price of 90 L and was based on existing OHC engine technology. By 1935, the International got hair-pin valve springs, straight exhaust, TT gearboxes, and alloy cylinder head just to name a few improvements so this machine could be bought as a strict racer with the engines being assembled by the racing department.

As someone once said, "Ah, for a time machine and a motorcycle trailer!".

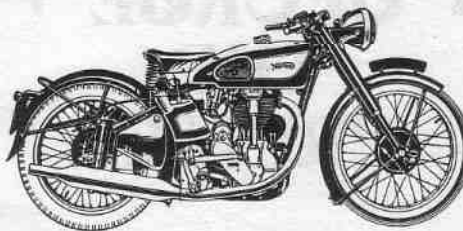
