2. The Officers of the club have a very real responsibility to represent as broad a spectrum of members as possible. The members, on the other hand, have a duty to be supportive of the officers. They do not have to agree with them all the time, but once an issue is settled, they should go along with the program cheerfully.
3. Votes of the membership are the proper way to settle club issues, but once settle the membership expects to move on to other serious matters like debauching, motorcycles and good fellowship, and on that note, I will move along cheerfully too.

The NDC, NORTON Owners Club, that is, is an organization for promoting fun with Norton motorcycles. In the past four or five years that I've been a member I've had quite a lot of fun with this club. I've enjoyed mountain riding weekends, white water rafting trips, beer busts, wine tours, and many, many Thursday night meetings. The only reason I was able to have such a good time, however, was the effort put forth by a handful of interested and dedicated club officers who were concerned enough to put these events together. Up until now, time, or more precisely a lack thereof, has prevented me from taking a more active role in making the club go, but I certainly have benefitted from all the effort of the club officers. I've been on the sidelines long enough to get the hang of how they do it, and with the opening created by the retiring Tom D. I'd like a chance to keep things going by running for club president.

On the fun side of things (this is the really important stuff), I'd like to organize more overnight rides during the summer, and try to have something to do (like exploring caves or racing around on sand dunes with ATCs) when we get there. This would provide a more ordered and efficient means for settling issues where there are too many sides to be heard during a general meeting. It would also serve to keep personality conflicts off the discussion floor at meetings and out of the pages of the Notice.

I'd also like to see a compilation of all the policy decisions made during past club meetings by the membership. All too often issues come up at meetings that have previously been decided and the ensuing debate often takes time that would be better spent using about the bikes. I think this compilation would also point out any areas where our policy differs from that of the NDC in England and settle current issues concerning Social and Associate membership. I don't see this as a major reorganization but more as a tidying up process that will benefit members by freeing up more time at meetings and by keeping the political necessities to a minimum.

Nortons motorcycles are really what this club is all about. The club can be a big part of the fun or a big part of the pain that goes with riding a Norton. If I get the chance, I'll make my best effort to maximize the fun and minimize the pain.

My first Norton was a 1958 Dominator "99", it was a 1963 and all my friends had Harleys, Triumphs or BSAs. There weren't too many Jap bikes around then and BMW was the only other European bike of any number on the street.

Norton was just about out of racing as far as the factory was concerned and the Atlas hadn't really caught on yet. Road racing wasn't that popular in the States, so the response I usually got was, what's a Norton?

When another Norton rider was spotted, even going in the opposite direction, immediate chase was given as if it was a long lost brother. When contact was made the conversation; "How long have you had your Norton?...any problems? ...any modifications, where can you get this, that or the other?" etc.

I always felt that Nortons were somehow special. Since then I've had an Atlas, three Commandoes and a featherbed hybrid, plus numerous other bikes, over thirty in all, but I've never been without a Norton.

Since my first Norton I noticed that Norton riders have always been more together than riders of other makes. I was invited to join the Norton Owner's Club, Northern California Branch in early 1971, but didn't because I thought it would be more like Robert's Rules of Order, than fun. I met Gene Austin in 1975 and he asked if I wanted to join and again I said no. Later he convinced me to at least go to a meeting. It was great. There were about 30 members in the branch and maybe a dozen at the meeting. We just drank beer and talked Nortons.

The club has gone through many changes since then, both in size and operation. After several months of discussion the club as it now exists was adopted in 1978. I've noticed in the last few years that conflicts amongst members are more numerous, with some justified, but most unnecessary. I think as long as someone has an interest in Norton Motorcycles, they can be as contributory to the club as anyone else. Example: Bob Vezzolini who doesn't own a Norton and who did the majority of the cooking at the Beer Bust this summer.

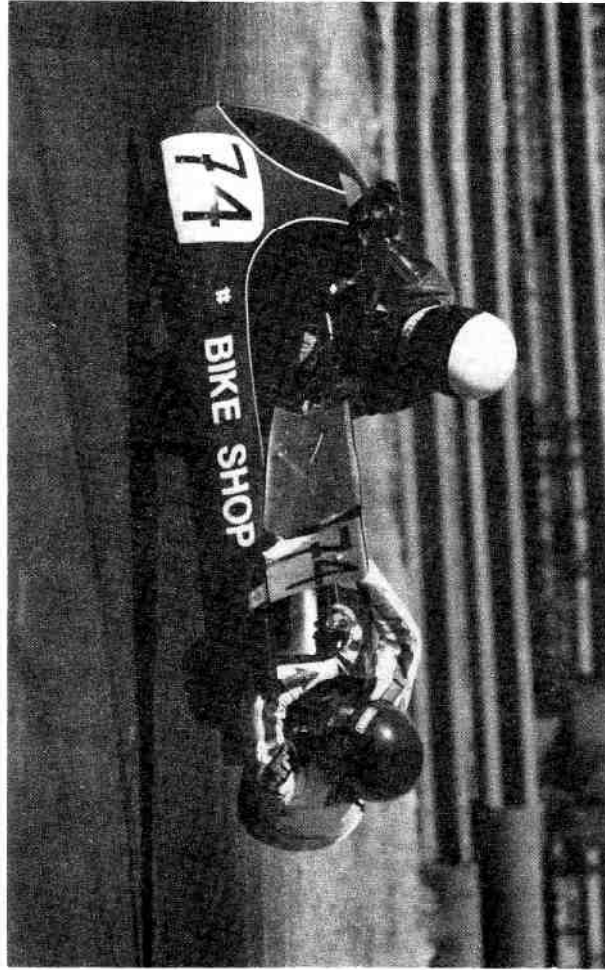
