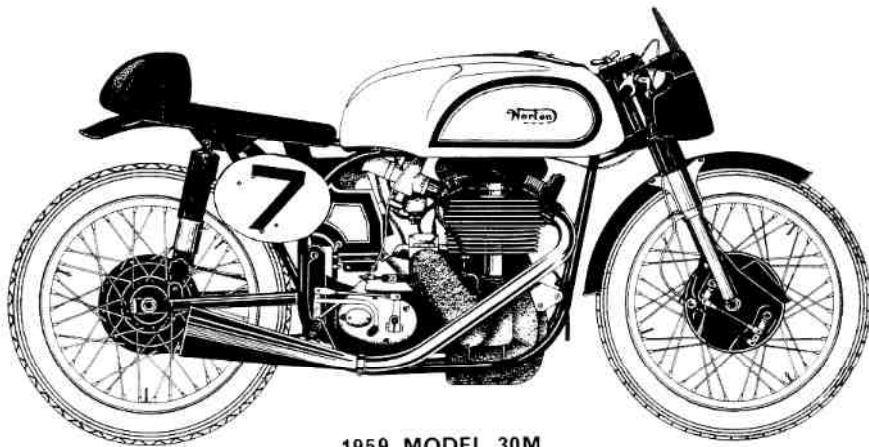

Cost is \$6 each plus \$1 if you want it mailed to you. Please send monies to me if you want to reserve one or more for yourself, (checks made payable to the Norton Owners Club). Don't delay it's later than you think!

If you hadn't noticed there was an announcement in Roadholder that the NOC has had to put up the membership dues for overseas members from £8.5 to £9. This is because they now have to pay VAT (purchase tax) on our dues paid to them. But now the good news. It won't affect the amount you pay. The branch funds are in reasonably sound shape, enough to withstand the increase without passing it on to you, the member. The favorable exchange rate between the U.S. dollars and the British pound helps. A sound treasury is possible when everyone renews their membership on time, nudge, nudge you know who you aren't.

The forthcoming Christmas party at Rick's on Sunday, December 16th looks like being a lot of fun. If you wish to partake in the branch sponsored meal, send your \$7 to Scot Marburger (money bags II), Who needs to know by the 12th of December how many are wanting a meal. Dear Noccers,

My name is Chris Richardson, a member of the NCNOC for about 5 years before being amended to a subscriber of the Notice and sadly living in the U.K. and not able to enjoy your club life, to me more preferable to the English one. I have met a few of you on my visits to California and made notable friendships with Phil Radford (a good Englishman!), Art Sirota, and Tim Coburn, so ask them if the offer i am about to make is a genuine one.

I would be happy to offer a search service to members looking for Parts, Books, in fact anything to do with Nortons, or motorcycles in general, to cover my costs I would have to charge a fee of £10 sterling at least for postage and telephone charges etc. Anyone interested should write to me at the address below, enclosing minimum £10 sterling Barclays Bank Draft or check or sterling check from any British Bank. I have to insist on this because banks charge too much to change small amounts of dollars even with

the favorable exchange rate. Any money left out of this fee would be returned if I find the part easily (i.e. I don't have to spend too much searching for it), or I can advise you if the search is not successful and ask if you want me to keep on searching for you. I am in contact with a guy who can rebuild Smiths speedometers and Rev counters and can offer newly rebuilt Chronometric ones too, at a good price. Also I have a contact for Lucas switches, the hard to get kind for early bikes and Dommies etc. often these switches can be altered if the correct part for your is not available and a similar switch is (they can be modified simply to increase the number of contacts or the number of switch positions. And for example turn a lighting switch into a combined Ign. and Lights switch. I have done this on my own bikes). Also some pattern switches are available and you have the choice of genuine or pattern, as available.

I have the original Manx catalogue page used in "Roy Bacon's book NORTON SINGLES" page 97, it's multi colored and not black and white as in the book. If there is enough interest, I plan to have copies made and laminated and permanently sealed between two sheets of clear acrylic plastic about 2.5 m.m. thick and virtually shatterproof. These would be ideal to hang in the home or workshop, to frame or be drilled and fixed with screws. The original is 8X10" but could be enlarged as printing is necessary of the original, any ideas on size is welcome but all would have to be the same size. Also I would like to do an enlarged version of the UNAPPROACHABLE NORTON decal in the same manner. What about the club logo? individuals can write to me or people can get together at club meets and discuss it. I have a variety of prints and photos which can be done this way and one offs may be possible if you have something you'd like done this way. As I am not a business I cannot avoid U.K. tax at the moment and it may be better to send things privately i.e. as gifts, let me know of any problems with U.S. customs, would you have to pay a tax? etc. The doolar/pound exchange rate is very good to you now so it can pay to buy British (perhaps I'll get a Queen's Award for Exports for that statement). To make it cost effective I would have a number made so anyone interested, please let me know.

Sometimes parts need be bought when I come across them or may go to someone else. If you are desperate for a part send what you think or want to pay for it (used parts mainly) and I'll try and get it, if not desperate search fee only, be realistic, if I get your part I'll advise shipping cost. Anything from small parts to bikes can be searched for.

MORE ON SPEEDO DRIVES

After reading Nick Wilts' article concerning surface hardening in the October NN, I asked Nick if he would do a Rockwell hardness test on each of the two gears from an unservicable Smiths speedo drive that I had lying about. Here are his findings.

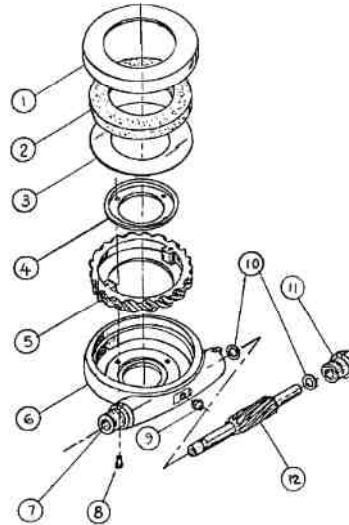
"The small gear that drives/turns the speedo cable exhibits a hardness of 32-35 Rockwell C-scale. The teeth on the small gear show a higher hardness of approximately 50(RC). The gear seems to be made of high carbon steel, which may be easily hardened to approximately 55-60(RC)".

"The large gear is much softer in hardness (softness?). It's hardness is too soft to be measured on the C-scale, so it was tested with a lighter load on the A-scale. This resulted in a reading of 39-42 (RA). The material of this gear appears to be a very low carbon steel, but it may still be hardened up to approximately 25(RC)".

"Both gears could be further hardened as the material is not used up to it's greatest potential- planned obsolescence! This phenomenon is not rare. From the foregoing, it is apparent that the material in the two gears has not been heat treated to obtain maximum wear properties for the application".

Now that our suspicions are confirmed, what can we do when the softer gear, the large one, wears out? Up to this point I've been cannibalizing parts from different speedo drives that have become unservicable and combining the parts in hopes of getting a servicable unit. But the limiting factor seems to be the scarcity of servicable large gears. I've inquired as to the possibility of buying new large gears from England but that doesn't seem possible.

What are now available are large gears made of plastic. OK, control the snickers! Assuming that the only part that needs to be replaced is the large gear, you can now rebuild your speedo drive with a \$15.95 kit that is available from Raber's European Cycle Works in San Jose. The kit only includes one plastic gear and four rivets, items 5 and 8 in the accompanying drawing. I talked to Bob Raber about this kit and he said that he "inherited" the kits from a shop that he bought out. The kits had first been sold about a year ago and he has sold 10 in the last 5 months that he has been in business. Only one complaint has been heard in these 10 cases, but in that particular case the rivets had been improperly installed, which allowed the gear to move around inside the speedo housing. I bought one of the kits, which is only available in the 15:12 ratio used on Commandos and found the instruction sheet complete and easy to understand. The worst part was cleaning the old parts prior to installing the plastic gear. Now I'm waiting to see how long the plastic gear lasts.



The grease interval with the plastic gear is still 5,000 miles, just like the stickerson new speedo drives. I personally think that's too long between lubrications (especially with a plastic gear), so I've been lubricating mine much more often than that. A little extra grease on the rear hub isn't nearly as bad as finding that your large gear just ate it.

Now for my little pitch, I have an incomplete speedo drive for my Dominator which is only missing item 4 (a dished washer) in the drawing. If you have one from an unservicable drive unit that you would like to sell, please let me know.
